# World Book Week at Withernsea Primary School


Next week, we will be celebrating World Book Day at Withernsea Primary School.

Mental Health Support Teams are working in our school.



We are excited to share that we are working with our Humber Teaching NHS Foundation Trust and East Riding local authority to deliver a brand-new service to support our children's Mental Health and Wellbeing in our school. The offer includes support and advice for school staff, parents and carers, whole school approaches, staff training, 1:1 and group interventions.

The service, which is currently known as the Mental Health Support Team, includes Education Mental Health Practitioners and Trainees, Senior MHST Practitioners and Professional leads who will provide early intervention support, advice, and guidance for our students. The team works alongside existing early intervention and early help services that supports our school, such as education psychology and the behaviour support team.

We welcome Katie to our school who will be working with us one day a week this academic year whilst she undertakes her training to become a qualified Education Mental Health Practitioner. Katie is excited to be joining our school community and is passionate about supporting children's mental health and helping them to be happy.

We will share regular updates about the services as it evolves, and I am sure you will see Katie and the team around the school at key events. We plan to hold coffee mornings in the near future with various focuses with the team which we hope families will attend. There will also be some parent workshops which will be free and available for families and we will share further information with you.

# Feed the Family for a Fiver!

Herby Toad in the Hole with Roasted Beetroot & Goats' Cheese Dressing



# Ingredients

140g Plain Flour

4 Large Eggs

300ml Semi Skimmed Milk

1 tbsp Wholegrain Mustard

1 tsp Dried Thyme
1 tsp Dried Parsley
Salt and Freshly Ground Black Pepper
2 tbsp Sunflower Oil
8 Specially Selected Pork Sausages (from 2 packs)
2 Red Onions, peeled and cut into wedges
1 pack Beetroot, drained and quartered
3 tbsp Balsamic Vinegar
1 tbsp Olive Oil 80g
½ pack Soft Goats' Cheese
2 tbsp Reduced Fat Crème Frâiche

1 tbsp Mixed Seeds

# Method

Crack the eggs into the milk and mix.

Put the flour into a mixing bowl and gradually whisk the eggs and milk into the flour until you have a smooth, lump-free batter.

Add the mustard, herbs and some seasoning.

Cover and set aside – preferably for a couple of hours.

Heat the oven to 220°C/Fan 200°C/425°F/Gas Mark 7.

Heat the oil in a large, deep, metal roasting tin and add the sausages and onions.

Cook for around 15 minutes until the sausages are browning. Meanwhile, place the beetroot in a second roasting tray and drizzle over the balsamic vinegar and oil.

Add some seasoning and cook in the oven with the sausages.

Remove the beetroot after 15 minutes and keep warm.

Pour the batter around the sausages and onions and cook for a further 25 minutes – do not open the door during this time.

In the meantime, mix together the goats' cheese and crème fraîche together with a little seasoning to make a dressing.

The toad is cooked when it is well-risen and golden brown.

Serve cut into wedges, with the beetroot and dressing and a sprinkling of seeds.

In maths we have been looking at length and height this week, talking about tall and short and long and short!

We have also been discussing celebrations when babies are born and learning about Christenings/baptisms.

We all enjoyed pancakes with various toppings on pancake day. We were also so excited that Mrs Thomson brought in her pet gecko for us all to meet to help us write our information texts in English. We have been learning about the main features of information texts and how they compare to fictional stories.

In Maths, we have started a new unit looking ag length and height. The children have been amazing at this and really understood the terms tall, tallest, short, longer and so on!

In Geography, we have started looking at physical features in the world around us. We are going to be comparing the physical features in Withernsea later in the unit.

We have had a very busy week this week as we have spent our mornings practising our test papers. We have done a fantastic job and feel very proud of ourselves!

Despite our busy mornings, the afternoons have also been action packed. We have been detectives in History this week, using facts hidden around the classroom to find out about our new significant person 'Grace Darling'. We are excited to find out even more in the coming weeks.

We have started a new song as part of our music lessons this week. We have been moving to the beat, finding the pulse and the rhythm and we have started the learn the words.

In Science we have continued our work on minibeasts and have been matching a variety of minibeasts to their habitat. We had to think carefully about where the minibeast would live and what makes each habitat suitable.

In DT we have been designing our lighthouses, thinking carefully about the features we need to include. Children are busy collecting materials at home, ready to construct their lighthouse in next week's lesson.

Finally, our RE work this week has focussed on something special that belongs to us. We will be looking at objects that are special to people of different faiths over the next few weeks.

We have been finishing off our clay models and will hopefully be sending them home soon!

We are all looking forward to world book day next week- our focus book is going to be 'The Journey'.
