

Pepperoni pizza pasta salad

Ingredients

- 1 bag Fusilli pasta
- 2 Tablespoons basil pesto
- 110 ml Italian dressing
- 20 pepperoni slices quartered
- 225g shredded Mozzarella cheese
- 50g shredded cheddar cheese
- 50g grated Parmesan cheese
- 1/2 cup cherry tomatoes; quartered optional

Method

- Cook pasta according to the package directions. Drain and rinse with cold water to cool.
- In a large bowl, mix together the cooled pasta, pesto and 1/4 cup of the Italian dressing. Mix until the pasta is evenly coated.
- Add the remaining ingredients plus the rest of the dressing. Cover and refrigerate until you
 are ready to serve. This can be refrigerated up to 2 days before serving. Enjoy!
