

Shortbread



Ingredients

- 125g/4oz unsalted <u>butter</u>, softened
- 55g/2oz <u>caster sugar</u>, plus extra to finish
- 180g/6oz plain flour

Method

- 1. Preheat the oven to 190C/170C Fan/Gas 5.
- 2. Beat the butter and the sugar together until smooth.
- 3. Stir in the flour to get a smooth paste. Turn on to a work surface and gently roll out until the paste is 1cm/½in thick.
- 4. Cut into shortbread rounds or fingers and place onto a baking tray. Sprinkle with caster sugar and chill in the fridge for 20 minutes.
- 5. Bake in the oven for 15–20 minutes, or until pale golden-brown. Set aside to cool on a wire

We have had a wonderful week in Year 2!

We have worked really hard in maths, looking at multiplication and division. We have discussed some tricky methods but have shown great resilience when completing our main task.

In English we have been exploring poetry, using Tony Mitton's Voice of Water as our focus. We have looked at the features used, had a go at creating some rhyming words and onomatopoeia and we even had a go at writing our own version of his poem - we were superstar poets!

In History, we had a very exciting visitor, Mr Parrish! He came to talk to us about the role of a firefighter and we compared this to what we know about the Great Fire of London. We recognised that in the modern day, firefighters receive specialist training, have safety equipment to wear and are given lots of important resources to help them put the fire out. This helped us to understand how difficult it must have been to control the fire in 1666.

In DT last week, we used our designs to create our own boats using various materials. This week we got to put them to the test, we put them into water and checked them against the brief. We needed our boat to be waterproof, to float, to stay rigid and to carry a passenger! Some of our boats passed the tests, others need a little repair work following our test due to using the wrong material, making them too heavy or them tipping over when a passenger boarded! We will be re-designing our boats next week to make them even better.

We look forward to welcoming you to our craft session on Monday afternoon at 2pm.
