### Working together

## Microwave Mug Cakes Recipe



### Ingredients

- 1 Tsp. Chopped Onion
- 1 Tsp. Chopped Spring Onions
- 1 Tsp. Salted Butter
- 2x Eggs
- 1 Tbsp. Red Pepper, Finely Diced
- 1 Tbsp. Cheddar, Grated
- 1 Tbsp. Parsley, Finely Chopped

### Method

1. Place the butter and chopped onion into a microwavable mug.
2. Cook for 30 seconds, then remove from the microwave and give it a good stir.
3. Once your mug has cooled down slightly, swish the onion and butter around the mug to coat the sides.
4. In a separate bowl, beat the eggs with a fork, then add the chopped red pepper, spring onion, grated cheese, chopped parsley, and a pinch of salt and pepper.
5. Pour the omelette mixture into the mug and place it back into the microwave, cook for 20 seconds.
6. Open the microwave and stir the egg, repeat cooking for 20 seconds and stir again.

7. Cook for a final 20 seconds until the egg mixture starts to set.
8. Remove the mug from the microwave and let it stand for 1 minute.


In our outdoor area, the children are enjoying the sunshine and being able to dig in the mud area and explore making tracks in the water.



In PE we are super lucky to be working with the coach from Hull FC, this half term we are working on Multi Skills and Team Games.


In DT we have spent time looking at different lighthouses and the features lighthouses have, we then designed a lighthouse ready to make next week.

We have had a lot of new beginnings in Year 3 this week and have noticed that many of the children have embraced their new academic challenges across the curriculum.


